This is the tentative schedule for Hoh Tribal Youth Spring Break 2018 (Weather Permitting):

Day 1: Guided educational tour of Dungeness National Wildlife Refuge in Sequim leaving Lower Hoh Road at 9:00 am and arriving at 10:30 am to start the tour. The Tour consists of the mammals, amphibians and marine life that inhabit the park as well as the woodland forests and plants. Once the tour is complete we will take the kids to the Forks Aquatic Club for two hours of swimming from 4:30-6:30 then return home.

Day 2: Travel to Sol Duc Falls for half a day beginning at 9:00 am and a pickup in Forks at 9:40. Afterward we will take the kids bowling in Forks at Sunset Lanes from 3:00 pm-5:00 pm.

Day 3: Travel to Sequim to the Northwest Raptor and Wildlife Center for a guided tour of the facility and animal hospital which will include Birds of Prey (Raptors), Owls, Coyotes, Foxes, Deer, Elk, Cougars, Raccoons and other mammals. Then head over to the Olympic Game Farm for some more animal adventures! Ending the day with a short hike to Marymere Falls weather/daylight permitting.

Day 4: Travel to Sequim to Happy Valley Alpaca Farm to check out the alpacas, learn about how to shear and make products out of their wool and how to care for them. Kids can interact with the alpacas on the tour. Next stop is the Dungeness Audubon Center and Railroad Bridge Park to check out the native plants, animals and birds that live in the park. It's only a short hike to check out the old Railroad Bridge as well as the Native Plant Garden and Taxidermy exhibits in the Library.

Day 5: We will end the week at the Makah Museum in Neah Bay for the morning then on to the Hoh Rain Forest and the Hall of Mosses for a short hike then a cookout in the park ending the day around 6:00 pm.
