Summary

Helps the Summer Food Cook prepare, season, and cook, soup, meat, vegetable, dessert, and other foods for consumption by Hoh Children.

Duties and Responsibilities The duties of this position include, but are not limited to:

- Become knowledgeable in the Summer Food Service Program
- Reads from menu and recipes to estimate food requirements and prepares the food for storage.
- Prepares food according to food safety requirements, and records temperatures of equipment and food at the time of service. Reinforces the practice of frequent hand-washing and takes steps to prevent cross contamination.
- Measures and mixes ingredients according to recipe, using a variety of kitchen utensils and equipment, such as blenders, mixers, grinders, slicers, and tenderizers, to prepare soups, salads, gravies, desserts sauces and casseroles.
- Bakes, roasts, broils or steams meats, fish, vegetables and other foods.
- Keeps accurate records of food used.
- Clean and sanitize work areas and equipment daily
- Wash daycare building floors daily
- Record temperature settings on coolers and freezers
- Detailed cleaning once per week

- **Reporting and Recording:**
- Collect data for a final narrative and data report which will include:
- Data reports and summaries of SFSP participation, promotion outcomes and contacts
- A conclusion highlighting successes, challenges and difficulties, and offering feasible
- suggestions for SFSP future operations
- Perform other duties as assigned by supervisor.

Education and Qualifications

- Must obtain or have a Valid Washington State Driver's License
- WA state food handlers card

This position is covered by the provisions of the Crime Control Act of 1990, Subchapter V - Child Care Worker Employee Background Checks (42 U.S.C. 13041) and the Indian Child Protection and Family Violence Prevention Act of 1990 (25 U.S.C. 3201-3210). As such, each applicant will be required, as a pre-condition to employment, to submit to a 5-year criminal history background check, including fingerprinting.

There will be no discrimination in selection process for this position because of race, color, age, sex, national origin, physical handicap, marital status, political membership or non-membership in an employee organization (43 CFR 17.3). If the applicants have equal qualifications, preference will be given to Native Americans and Alaskan Natives (Title 25 USC). Applicants claiming Indian preference must submit verification of Indian certification by tribe of affiliation or other acceptable documentation of Indian heritage. All other interested persons are encouraged to apply.
