Hoh Tribe 2022-23 Dungeness Crab C&S Fishing Regulation

Fishery: Ceremonial and Subsistence Dungeness Crab

Season: November 1, 2022 through October 31, 2023

Management Area: Quileute River (47 deg. 54' 18" N. latitude)
Quinault River (47 deg. 21'00" N. latitude)

Regulations: All unattended gear must be marked with a buoy visible on the surface, marked with the owner or operator of the fishing gear

Pot gear must have at least two circular escape rings located on the upper half of the pot, each measuring at least 4 ¼ inches in inside diameter. Pot gear must have "rot away" cord such that entrapped crab can escape from lost or abandoned pots.

The sale of Dungeness crab harvested for ceremonial and subsistence use is prohibited due to potential health concerns with biotoxins.

No Pot Limit

Harvest Restrictions: No Bag Limit

6 ¼ inches minimum size (caliper measure)

Harvest of Females Prohibited

CATCH REPORTING: All catch data and fish catch tickets shall be provided to the Hoh Tribal Fisheries Management Biologist within 24 hours of Landing. All catch must have been reported prior to subsequent departure
