Hoh Tribe 2023 Clam Regulations
C&S Fishing Regulation

This regulation supersedes all previous Clam C&S Fishing Regulations

- Fishery: Razor Clam and Other Intertidal Bivalve
- Fishery Purpose: Clam and Mussels harvest regulation for personal use and shall not be sold.
- Season: January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023
- Management Area: Quileute River (47 deg. 54' 18" N. latitude)
Quinault River (47 deg. 21' 00" N. latitude)
- Effort: 2 days/month with up to 20 people/day
- Legal Gear: Hand held fork, rake, shovel, pots and other gear that the tribe deems is not environmentally harmful.
- Species and Limits: Allowed species and limits are provided below:
- Razor Clams: 100 Clams per person per day
- Steamers: 50 lbs. per person per day
- Butter Clams: 50 lbs. per person per day
- Mussels: 50 lbs. per person per day
- Misc. Species: 50 lbs. per person per day

CATCH REPORTING: The Hoh Tribe will monitor C&S shellfish harvest through interviewing and information reported directly to Hoh Natural Resources.

All tribal members harvesting clams and other shellfish are encouraged to check in with Hoh Natural Resources prior to harvest, for information on biotoxin test levels to ensure shellfish are safe for consumption. Authorized tribal fisherman must have in their possession a Tribal identification card.
