HOH TRIBE 2025 OCEAN SALMON REGULATION

FISHERY:

Commercial - Treaty Troll

TARGET SPECIES:

Chinook Salmon, Coho Salmon

MGMT. PERIOD:

July 1, 2025 through September 15, 2025

MGMT. AREA:

Quileute River (47 deg. 54' 18" N. latitude) Quinault River (47 deg. 21'00" N. latitude)

Closed Area:

The area within a 6 nautical mile radius of the mouths of the Queets River 47°31'42"N and Hoh River

47º45'12"N will be closed to commercial fishing. A closure is also in effect within a 2-mile radius of the

mouth of the Quinault River

July 1 through September 15 Subfishery: All Species

Open: July 1, 2025

Closes: September 15, 2025 or upon harvest of 22,500 Chinook and 37,500 Coho

(unharvested Chinook salmon in the opening sub-fishery may be re-allocated to the second sub-fishery on a

limiting stock, impact-neutral basis)

Retention of Chum prohibited August 1, 2025 - August 31, 2025

GEAR RESTRICTIONS:

Non-Trawl Gear. Single point, single shank, barbless hooks are required in all fisheries.

No more than eight fixed lines per boat.

SIZE LIMIT:

Chinook - minimum commercial harvestable size 24" in total length Coho – minimum commercial harvestable size 16" in total length

CATCH REPORTING:

All catch data and fish catch tickets shall be provided to the Hoh Tribal Fisheries

Management Biologist within 24 hours of landing. All catch must have been reported

prior to subsequent departure.

HARVEST SAMPLING:

All catch shall be made available for sampling by the Hoh Tribal Fisheries Management

Biologist or Hoh Tribal Staff as necessary for biological sampling.
