### HOH TRIBE 2026 OCEAN SALMON REGULATION

FISHERY: Commercial – Treaty Troll

TARGET SPECIES: Chinook Salmon

MGMT. PERIOD: May 1, 2026 through June 30, 2026

MGMT. AREA: Quileute River (47 deg. 54' 18" N. latitude)  
Quinault River (47 deg. 21'00" N. latitude)

Closed Area: The area within a 6 nautical mile radius of the mouths of the Queets River 47°31'42"N and Hoh River 47°45'12"N will be closed to commercial fishing. A closure is also in effect within a 2-mile radius of the mouth of the Quinault River

**May 1 through June 30 Subfishery:** Chinook Directed

Open: May 1, 2026

Closes: June 30, 2026 or upon harvest of 22,500 Chinook

Retention of Coho prohibited (personal use C&S retention permitted)

GEAR RESTRICTIONS: Non-Trawl Gear. Single point, single shank, barbless hooks are required in all fisheries.  
No more than eight fixed lines per boat.

SIZE LIMIT: Chinook - minimum commercial harvestable size 24" in total length

CATCH REPORTING: All catch data and fish catch tickets shall be provided to the Hoh Tribal Fisheries Management Biologist within 24 hours of landing. All catch must have been reported prior to subsequent departure.

HARVEST SAMPLING: All catch shall be made available for sampling by the Hoh Tribal Fisheries Management Biologist or Hoh Tribal Staff as necessary for biological sampling.
